## Nominations

The nominating committee announces that the President (Elda Vail), Vice President (Joan Rohan), Secretary (Muffy Petrick), and Treasurer (Joyce VandeBunt) have all agreed to run for re-election. An Officer At Large and various committee chairpersons are needed. Further nominations will be taken at the April 3rd club meeting. Elections will be held at the May 1st meeting at Hawthorn Hollow Nature Center.

Attention all birdwatchers, novice to expert! Your help is greatly needed to survey Racine & Kenosha counties for evidence of breeding birds. This project is organized by the Wis. DNR and the Society for Ornithology. Some Hoy Club members have already been assigned their WISCONSIN areas (a 3 mile by 3 mile "block") and have collected data on mating, BREEDING BIRD nesting, and evidence of baby birds. Assistants to these people are ATLAS needed, or start your own small group! You will need to go out for seven to ten field trips of about 4 - 5 hours length between April and August. Your information will be included in a Wisconsin Breeding Bird Atlas that will be used by scientists, industries, land-use planners, and nature lovers. Please call the local project coordinator, Jerry DeBoer at 835-4642 from 9:00am to 2:00pm. Also call him if you see any evidence of nesting behavior, especially in our less common birds.

SHOULD HOY NATURE CLUB BECOME AN AUDUBON SOCIETY CHAPTER? That was the topic of our March 6 meeting, as presented by regional representative Bill Hallstrom from Beloit. Hoy Club members enjoyed a lively discussion that highlighted the pros & cons. The Hoy Board of Directors would like input from every member, as this will eventually be put to a vote. If you have any comments or want to be part of the study committee, call President Vail. Here's a brief summary of facts: BENEFITS. Increase in membership, as 200 Audubon members live east of I-94 in Racine & Kenosha. They would be potential members, but we would have to call & recruit them. Some Hoy members are already included in this number, which would be determined by surveying each member. Further benefits: more influence with elected officials, networking withother chapters for programs & field trips, discounted entrance to some reserves & sanctuaries. Hoy Club would keep its name, goals, & types of activities. FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS. Current Hoy dues are \$10 and up. Audubon dues of \$20 (\$15 senior) would be required of each member, though some of us are already paid for 1997. We would be required to recruit 35 new people to start up the chapter. Alot of work for first 2 yrs.
