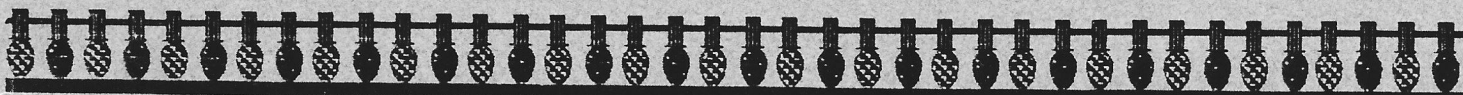
COMING EVENTS

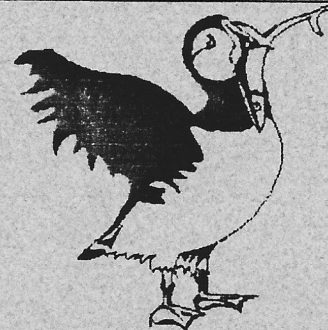


THURSDAY, DECEMBER 4, 5:30 P.M., RIVERBEND NATURE CENTER.

FIELD GUIDE TO BIRDS OF EASTERN AND WESTERN REGIONS.

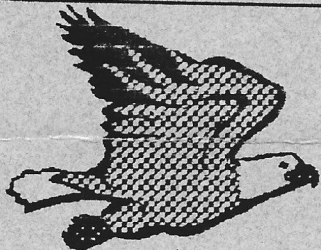

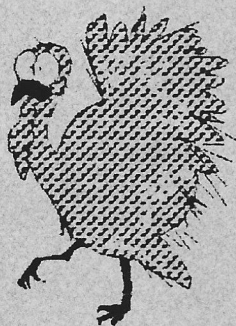
