SHADE TREE DISORDERS by DR PATTI NAGAI, UW EXTENSION, Horticulture Agent, Racine County.


These disorders are often noticed during summer months when leaves start showing leaf spotting, marginal necrosis (brown leaf edges), early yellowing and leaf drop. Information on what pathologies are involved and why, and how we can help our trees survive these diseases (caused by Oak Wilt, Maple Scorch, Anthracnose, Dutch Elm Disease and environmental stress) will be discussed.

There will an update on Caledonia Parks by Beth Paul, the new Caledonia Parks director along with a 10-15 minute bird slide presentation by Ed Prins. Refreshments will be provided by Allison Werner and Carol Rasoul.
