
Hoy Audubon celebrates 40th year.

Sunday, January 2nd—Racine Christmas Bird Count

More than 50,000 observers in the Western Hemisphere participate each year in this all-day census of early-winter bird populations. The results of their efforts are compiled into the longest running database in ornithology, representing over a century of unbroken data on trends of early-winter bird populations across the Americas. Simply put, the Christmas Bird Count, or "CBC", is citizen science in action. Join us on foot and by car for a half day or whole day as we count each bird we find in varied habitats. Home feeder watchers can also participate. Those new to CBC's can be paired with more experienced birders where possible. A \$5 dollar fee per participant is requested to help National Audubon Society defray the cost of compiling the data. Birders under 18 are free.
